

Students must meet the following requirements to graduate and earn a BHISD Diploma:


- Complete the required 26 credits for the

Grade Point Average

- AP (Advanced Placement) classes are weighted at highest level.
- DC (Dual Credit) classes are weighted second highest level.
- In order to count towards the GPA, the course MUST BE taken during the school day, during the course of the school year.
- Dual Credit courses taken during the summer will not count toward GPA.

Automatic College Admissions

- Students in top 10% are eligible for automatic admission to any Texas public college or university.
 - Exception: UT Austin-top 6%
- Must graduate with distinguished level of achievement, or meet college readiness standards on SAT or ACT, to be eligible for automatic admissions.

Texas Success Initiative (TSI)

The Texas Success Initiative (TSI) is the statute that requires all Texas public institutions of higher education to determine the readiness of all nonexempt, entering undergraduate students to enroll in freshman-level academic courses (see TEC, 51.336).

What's the Texas Success Initiative Assessment 2.0?

- The Texas Assessment Initiative Assessment 2.0 (TSIA2) is the assessment instrument used to determine college readiness for non-exempt students, as required by the Texas Success Initiative.
- TSIA2 helps determine whether you're ready for college-level coursework in English language arts and reading (ELAR) and mathematics.

TSIA (2.0) Exemptions

Exam Type	Minimum Scores
ACT	23 Composite: 19 on both English and Math sections
SAT	Critical Reading 480 and Math 530
STAAR EOC	Dual Credit: English II 4000, Algebra I 4000 and C or better in Algebra II

Recommendation Letters

Give the recommender at minimum a week to write a good letter of recommendation.

Why Keep a Resume?

It is a way of collecting and organizing academic, extracurricular, and job-related experiences.

This information is used for applications for colleges, scholarships, and employment.

The resume is designed to keep your information organized and in one place.

Transcripts

Transcripts are sent through the Registrar's office.

\$2 fee per transcript sent electronically

- \$1 for pickup of official transcripts
- If out of state, use parchment or SendEDU, depending on the school

If it needs to be mailed, you must provide the mailing address.

Submit application first, then request a transcript.

What about FAFSA?

Even if you think you will not qualify for anything, FILL OUT FAFSA!

Many scholarships and universities require proof that you've completed FAFSA.

FAFSA opens October 1st of your Senior year.

FAFSA is now a graduation requirement!
