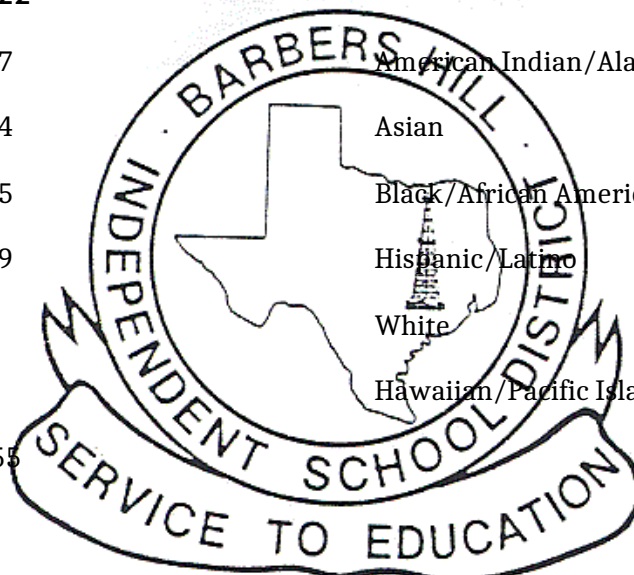

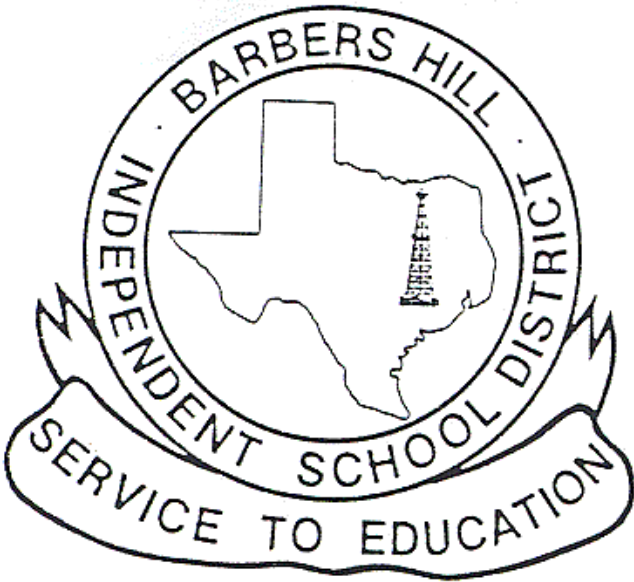

COVID Learning

During the 2019-2020 school year, Barbers Hill students participated in remote learning when the pandemic began. Grading was based on completion of assignments. Any grades earned during virtual learning were not counted into a student's GPA.

During the 2020-2021 school year, Barbers Hill students began the year with the option of learning either virtually or face-to-face. 83% of BHHS students chose to learn in person. At the end of the second six weeks, the district required all students to return to in person learning.
